Boston Police Plan Outline

Two Boston Police Patrol Officers will be assigned to the Gardner Street, Ashford Street, and Pratt Street (GAP) neighborhood by the Boston Police District Supervisors.

Beginning on September 9 and continuing through October 30 (Halloween weekend), this overtime assignment will be made on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday mornings from Midnight until 4:00am.

Officers who are assigned will patrol the neighborhood in a marked patrol vehicle identifying:

- Minors in possession of alcohol
- Persons procuring alcohol to minors
- Persons consuming alcohol on public property
- Respond to calls for loud parties
- Identify and break up large house parties
- Respond and control large groups and street disturbances

Officers will summons or issue citations for all persons stopped and identified as violating city ordinances and Mass General Laws. The appropriate incident reports will be completed for these actions.

Each morning, a Boston University police supervisor will contact the BPD supervisor to collect the information and data for the activity that occurred during the previous assignment. This information will include all students and non affiliates arrested, summonsed, citied and for what offenses. In addition, medical calls where persons are transported to area hospitals will be reported; and parties identified and affiliated with BU students.

Once collected, the information will be sent to the appropriate members of the Alcohol Task Force at Boston University.

Brookline Police Outline

Brookline Police are assigning two patrol officers and a bicycle officer to patrol areas in Brookline that border the Boston University campus including the Dexter Park complex, Pleasant Street, Freeman Street, and St. Paul Street neighborhoods' that have experienced a growing amount of offcampus students moving into the area.

A Boston University bicycle officers will be assigned with the Brookline Police to patrol these areas. This has begun on Friday morning August 26 and will continue every Friday and Saturday morning through the first weekend in October.

Officers will be identifying and taking the appropriate action for:

- Minors in possession of alcohol
- Persons procuring alcohol at various liquor stores for minors
- Public drinking
- Large parties and area disturbances

The BU bicycle officers will collect the data of the activity for each assignment and submit it to the BU police supervisor who will the send this information it to the appropriate members of the Alcohol Task Force.

Boston University Police Outline

Beginning September 9 and continuing each weekend through October 30 two BU police officers will be assigned in plain clothes in an unmarked vehicle from 8:00pm through 4:00am.

Officers assigned will be patrolling the Boston University campus and adjacent streets identifying and taking the appropriate action for activity including:

- Minors in possession of alcohol
- Persons procuring alcohol at various liquor stores and attempting to carry it onto campus
- Public drinking with focus on Ashford, Babcock, and Gardner streets that lead into the Allston GAP area patrolled by the Boston Police.

Officers will be citing and summonsing all persons identified as violating Mass Criminal Law and city ordinances with the standard incident reports completed. This information and activity will be collected and submitted to the Alcohol Task Force by the BU supervisor.
